



PE and Sport Funding 2017 – 2018

Background:

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. This funding is ring-fenced, to be used for sport specific areas, to make an impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Current numbers on roll: 64

Number of children in Years 1 to 2 who are eligible for Sport Premium = 31

Funding received for 2017/18:

£16,000 plus £10 per pupil aged 5-11 years old = Total £ 16,500

Received in 2 payments (November 2017 /April 2018)

- Employing a PLPS Coach to team-teach alongside teachers to raise standards within Physical Education and Sport.
- Employing PLPS Coach to run after school clubs for Key Stage One pupils.
- Employing PLPS Coach to run after lunch time clubs for Key Stage One and EYFS.
- Continuous Professional Development: PLPS Head Coach will nominate and promote teachers to undergo the FA Primary Teachers Award.

Newark & Sherwood School Sports Partnership

- Employing a coach to team-teach alongside teachers to raise standards within Physical Education and Sport.
- Weekly PE sessions for Key Stage Year One and Year Two pupils.
- Advice and support to help build a long term PE and Sport future for your school- lesson ideas, CPD, Change 4 Life.

Provision of new playground trim trail and surfacing.

- Enhancements to school grounds to increase levels of physical activity.
